Step 1) Open your internet browser and type in the following link:

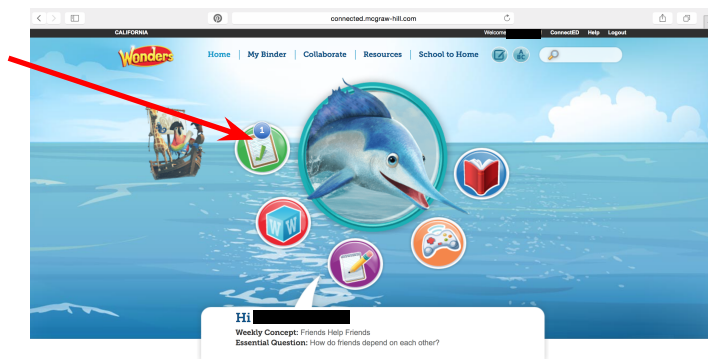

Step 2) Enter your child's log in information provided to you

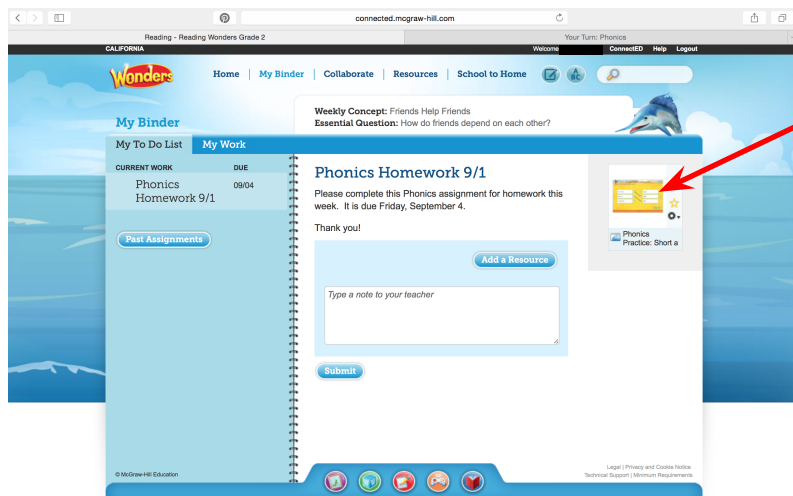
Step 3) Click on the "To Do" button

Step 5) Read the directions and click on the assignment image



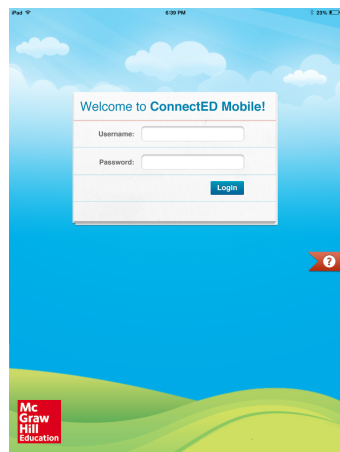
Step 6) Follow the instructions to complete the assignment

TABLET LOG IN INSTRUCTIONS:

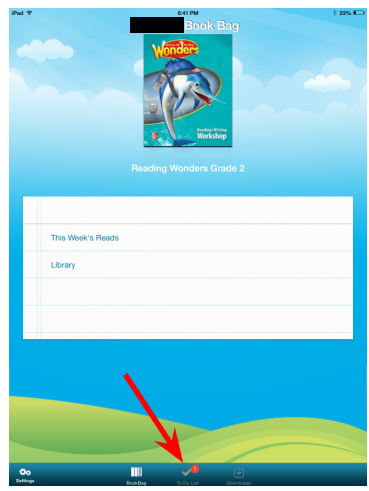
Step 1) Download the “McGraw-Hill K-12 ConnectED Mobile” from your tablet’s App Store



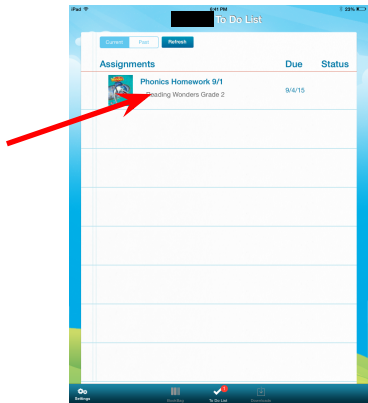
Step 2) Open the App and use your child’s login information on the card provided to Login.



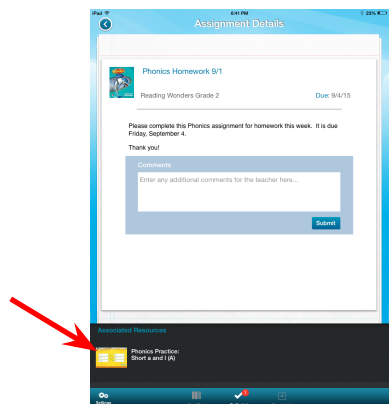
